

Delmarva transmission tower replacement project

Here is a statement from Delmarva Power on the status of their transmission tower replacement project: "All work for this spring is complete. We will return in the fall to complete the towers and pull wire from the substation near Green Acres behind Carrcroft and over to the substation on Marsh Road. We will also be temporarily doing restoration along the right of way and sidewalks, since we will be back in the fall. After the project in the fall we can conduct a more thorough restoration."

Athens Road water main replacement project

Here is a statement from Veolia on the status of the Athens Road project: "Veolia is reaching the final stages of the water main restoration occurring on Athens Road between Quincy and Grinnell. All new water main has now been installed, and Veolia has completed flushing & pressure testing of those mains. There are two more service lines left to install and Veolia expects to complete those installations between June 12-16. Following those installations, Veolia expects 1-2 weeks of restoration weather permitting to top soil, seed and base concrete. DelDOT will be performing the repaving of the road."



Augustine Cutoff bike path

Improved bike facilities along Augustine Cut Off were identified as a priority in the New Castle County Bicycle Plan and City of Wilmington Bike Plan. The project was submitted to

DelDOT in 2020 by WILMAPCO for consideration in the FY22 Bike/ Ped Pool and it ranked highest, moving it to concept development.

This project will explore options for bicycle and pedestrian improvements along Augustine Cut Off that will link the state's two largest population centers, the City of Wilmington and Brandywine Hundred, by connecting the greater Blue Ball/U.S. 202 Pathway system to Trolley Square and the Brandywine Park trail network.

Forwood Preserve Park

Now that we have seen the loss of trees and wildlife habitat related to the Forwood Commons development project (on the south side of Silverside Road behind the Shoppes of Graylyn), we should be more thankful than ever to have Forwood Preserve Park. This 16-acre area of woodlands bordered by Marsh and Veale Roads and Stony Run Drive is owned by New Castle County and is not subject to commercial development.

People may not think of the Forwood Preserve as a "park," since it is does not have playgrounds or benches or gazebos. The long-term vision for the property will see it maintained in a largely unmodified state, perhaps with some walking paths added, so it will be a place where residents of adjoining communities can go to enjoy a peaceful and restorative natural environment. The current focus of the Friends of Forwood Preserve Park non-profit group is to work with New the Castle County parks division on halting the progress of invasive species, particularly wisteria vines that are killing trees at an alarming rate.

The Friends group also urges any long-time residents of Green Acres and Brandywine Hundred to share any recollections they have of the earlier days of this parcel, when structures built and lived in by the Allen family were still standing. They are interested in preserving any information about the site and its history before recollections are lost to time. DelDOT curb construction project on Stanford

As this newsletter is being prepared for publication, preliminary surveying and road marking work is being done by a DelDOT contractor on Stanford Road. This is in preparation for rebuilding the curbs to include ADA-compliant ramps, and later a permanent repaying of the road, which at the moment still has temporary asphalt patches that were laid down after Veolia's water main replacement project last year. That's all the details we have at the moment, but we'll update the website if we hear more.
